The reasons we invest in a network is to bring rich information into the classroom, but it only makes sense to have rich information in the classroom if you're going to let kids ask questions and explore questions. Jamie McKenzie, editor of *From Now On* the educational technology journal and independent technology consultant, has spent the last three decades working in the education field. He has served as a superintendent, principal, professor, and director of libraries, media and technology. He currently works as an independent consultant presenting keynote speeches at international and national conferences, providing staff development workshops to school districts and educational organisations, and helping educational organisations and schools to stay focused on student learning when developing their technology plans.

Smart learning with new technologies

Jamie McKenzie explores ways to make inquiry and information literacies the focus of new technology usage in the schools in contrast to the 'powerpointness' that can all too often plague ICT programs.
